Where stylists buy their bedding Beautiful Basics: Bedlinen Let's just start by saying that caring for linen items is simple and fairly simple - high-quality linen fabric is sturdy and sturdy in itself, so you don't have to slave away the trend toward its whim. However, if you want to make the most of your linen elements, here are some basic rules that you should follow. How to wash linen items can be like washing your hands and washing machines - any of these methods are fine and won't stretch or cut your laundry. If you experience damage while washing, this may be due to the quality of the fabric or chemicals involved. Machine wash: 1. Separate white, dark and colored underwear. For best results, wash separately from other fabrics. 2. Wash in warm water (40 degrees Celsius/104 degrees Fahrenheit). High temperatures can cause shrinkage of up to 10% and weaken flax fiber. 3. Use the car's gentle cycle and do not overload the washing machine. 4. Use a soft detergent formulated for delicate fabrics. Don't bleach. Hand washing: 1. Fill a small container (bucket or sink) with warm water and add about a teaspoon of soft detergent. 2. Immerse the linen clothes in warm water and let it soak for about 10 minutes. 3. Gently whizz the item around. Don't wring, twist or scrub as it can stretch the fabric. 4. Drain the soapy water and rinse repeatedly until the soapy residues are all gone. Hang to dry. Many of you ask us for advice on how to wash linen sheets and other bedding items. The same rules apply with a couple of more important things to celebrate. First, prepare the laundry by turning them inside out and buttoning all the buttons, buttoning the zippers, tying the ties, etc. then make sure your laundry has enough space so that it can be rinsed properly. You can wash bedding with other delicacies, but don't mix it with heavy items like towels, denim. How to wash linen clothes? Since linen clothing is usually more detailed and structured than, for example, linen sheets or blankets, this may require some extra attention when washing. One thing many people want to avoid - or at least control - is the creasing that happens with linen clothing. Several ways to do this are by washing linen clothing in plenty of space and hanging it to dry immediately after washing. The basic rule of getting stains out of flax does so as soon as they develop. If you allow dirt, oil, fat and other stains to sit, they will absorb deeply into fiber-making removals a difficult and annoying task. If you have a small stain, try soaking it in a water detergent solution or washing it with club soda. If that doesn't help, you can A little soap dish and gently massage it until the dirt comes out and then wash it as you normally would. Some spots are trickier and can move away from spraying baking soda and a few drops of vinegar on the fabric and then blotting it with a paper towel to soak up the moisture. Drying laundry Drying your underwear is a method our own choice, but let's run through the basics. Pre-washed linen products can be easily automated (fall) dried on low heat. Remove from the dryer when they are still a little wet and hang or lie flat to finish the process. Air drying is another great option that saves on electricity and adds softness to linen elements. Line dry your items or dry them flat on a white towel. Not a good idea. Bleach and detergents with optical lighters tend to weaken the fibers and can cause discoloration. If you are dealing with a stain, please refer to the steps mentioned above. Softened linen naturally becomes softer with each wash, and stone washed linen should already be at maximum softness. Tissue softeners (liquid or dry sheets) weaken the fibers and cover them, reducing their absorption and wick. Iron linen natural fibers, such as linen linen, will wrinkle, crumple and folds, you just have to take it. However, if you really want the item pressed, use a medium hot iron on the fabric while it is still wet or apply it with a damp towel. Keeping laundry Make sure your underwear is completely dry to avoid mold. Natural fibers, such as underwear, should breathe, so it is better to store them in cool, dry, well-ventilated rooms and away from direct sunlight. Avoid storing flax plastic bags - choose linen bags or reuse old pillowcases for this. When it comes to bed linen, we recommend using three sets of rotations: one on the bed, one in the closet, and one in the wash. This will allow each set to take a break from washing to washing and extend the life of your laundry.
